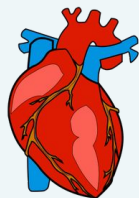

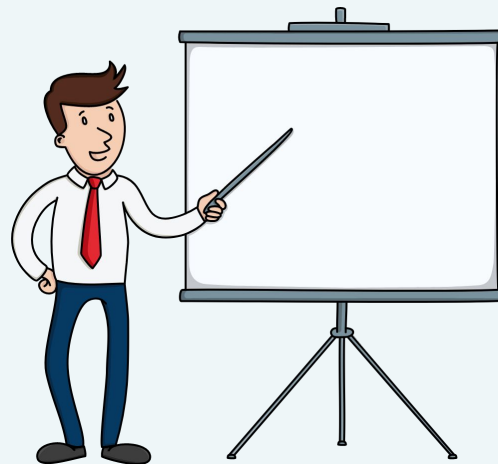

As you have identified what the difference is between **WANTING** and **NEEDING** something, we are now going to look at what humans **NEED**.

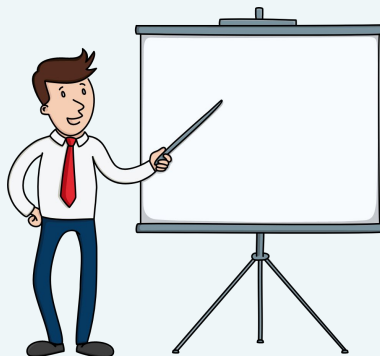

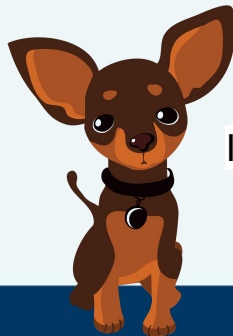
It costs around £700 a year in the UK to keep an average-sized dog.
