1. Overall Job Purpose

To plan, risk assess, deliver and evaluate animal welfare education sessions and activities for children and young adults.

The role involves both assisting the education team and providing cover during education staff absence. The role involves being flexible to work weekdays, evenings and weekends as and when required.

3. Key Tasks/Job Description

Generic:

Plan, risk assess, deliver and evaluate daytime and evening animal welfare education and personal development sessions for children and young people.

Plan, risk assess, deliver and evaluate residential visits for children and young people

Encourage and assist children and young people to make the most of opportunities to develop confidence, skills, develop understanding and empathy for animals and learn about the work of the RSPCA.

Promote the work of the centre to schools, youth and children's organisations as well as the general public and the wider community through participation in on site and community events as required.

Contribute towards the development, monitoring and evaluation of educational resources and programmes to ensure high quality learning is maintained.

Assist with the training and supervision of work experience and adult education volunteers.

Maintain high standards of health and safety and child/vulnerable adult safeguarding

through understanding and adherence to education and society policies and procedures.

Undertake routine duties such as administration, record keeping, answering enquiries and assisting visitors as well as duties and responsibilities that may be reasonably required by the post holders line manager.

Work closely with other centre staff to ensure the safety and cleanliness of education facilities for staff and visitors.

Attend and contribute to education and staff meetings as required / Report verbally and in writing on educational matters and contribute to local and national reports and publications as required.

Mallydams only:

Provide occasional overnight cover on site during residential courses for children, families or young people

Report verbally and in writing on educational matters and contribute to local and national reports and publications as required.

Attend and contribute to education and staff meetings as required.

Stapeley Grange only:

Developing, advertising and creating fundraising activities / children's activities - includes monthly wildlife club.

Running workshop in schools alongside Volunteer Speaker activities.
