

## FOUND A BABY BIRD UT OF THE NEST

## WHAT TO DO NEXT



**FLEDGLING** 

Is it sick or injured?

YES

Is the bird in a position of danger?

Move to a safe place – only a very short distance away. **DOES IT HAVE FEATHERS?** 

Take to a vet as priority for NESTLINGS. If vet not available - take to a local rescue centre or call the RSPCA on 0300 1234 999.

Take to a local rescue centre or vet. If neither available call the RSPCA on 0300 1234 999.

Is an adult bird dead nearby?

Leave alone and monitor for at least two hours. Are adult/s returning?

No need to do more – leave it alone.

for at least one hour. Are adult/s returning?
