Our team days are located at our animal centres across England, where we provide animals in need with a place of rescue, rehabilitation and a chance to find a new home. Days typically run from 10am – 4pm. A tour of the centre is included, as well as drink refreshments throughout the day.

Our animal care staff are so busy in the direct care of the animals that they often struggle to find the time to improve the environment the animals live in. Our centres are located across the country and look after thousands of cats, dogs, horses and small animals. Each centre appreciates the help of teams of volunteers who will undertake painting, gardening and other maintenance roles. These jobs are so important to make the centre as good as it can be for our animals and potential adopters visiting the centre.

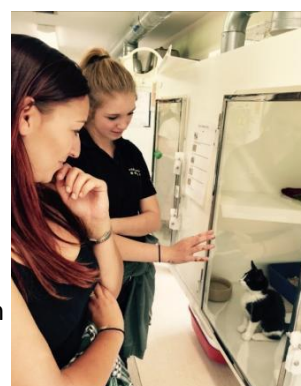

The details

Your help will make a direct impact on the work of the centre and we are grateful for your contribution. We ask for a donation to cover the cost of organising and supervising the day, which starts at £50 per head (plus VAT).

Each member of the team must complete online H&S training before attending the day. On the day, one member of the team will be designated as the team leader who will be in charge of liaising with the Animal Centre Staff regarding tasks you will be assigned.

We also love our volunteers to have a tour of the centre and to meet the animals in our care. Due to health and safety and the special needs of many of our animals, direct contact is supervised by our staff.

No experience with animals is necessary, but lots of enthusiasm and a willingness to get stuck in is very welcome! Volunteers will need a packed lunch, some sturdy shoes and some old clothes.
